Public holidays

Date	Day	Holiday	Type
Jan 1	Saturday	New Year's Day Falls on a Saturday in 2028. When a holiday overlaps a weekend, the annual notice usually grants public administration staff a compensatory rest day (補假) on the next working day.	Public holiday
Jan 26	Wednesday	Lunar New Year (First Day) Wednesday - the first day of the Year of the Monkey, projected from the lunar calendar. With the second and third days it starts a five-day break through Sunday January 30.	Public holiday
Jan 27	Thursday	Lunar New Year (Second Day) Thursday, the middle of the Lunar New Year block.	Public holiday
Jan 28	Friday	Lunar New Year (Third Day) Friday, flowing straight into the weekend - five consecutive days off without using any leave.	Public holiday
Apr 4	Tuesday	Ching Ming Festival Tuesday in 2028 (the leap year moves Ching Ming to April 4). Take Monday April 3 off and the break runs four days, April 1-4.	Public holiday
Apr 14	Friday	Good Friday Friday - Easter Sunday falls on April 16 in 2028, so Good Friday opens the three-day Easter break.	Public holiday
Apr 15	Saturday	The day before Easter Always a Saturday. Together with Good Friday and Easter Sunday it makes a three-day weekend, April 14-16.	Public holiday
May 1	Monday	Labour Day Monday - and Buddha's Birthday follows on Tuesday, so the weekend of April 29-30 merges into a four-day break ending May 2.	Public holiday
May 2	Tuesday	The Buddha's Birthday (Feast of Buddha) Tuesday (lunar 4/8), the day after Labour Day - two consecutive holidays rounding off a four-day break.	Public holiday
May 28	Sunday	Tung Ng Festival (Dragon Boat Festival) Falls on a Sunday in 2028 (lunar 5/5). The annual notice usually grants public administration staff the following Monday as a compensatory rest day - confirm when the 2028 order is gazetted.	Public holiday
Oct 1	Sunday	National Day of the People's Republic of China Falls on a Sunday in 2028. As with other Sunday overlaps, the gazetted notice is expected to assign a compensatory rest day to public administration staff.	Public holiday

Date	Day	Holiday	Type
Oct 2	Monday	The day following National Day Monday - with the weekend it gives a three-day break, September 30 to October 2. Take Tuesday October 3 off and it links to the day after Mid-Autumn for five days.	Public holiday
Oct 4	Wednesday	The day following the Mid-Autumn Festival Wednesday - the Mid-Autumn Festival itself falls on Tuesday October 3 in 2028, and Macau holidays the day after, not the festival day.	Public holiday
Oct 26	Thursday	Chong Yeung Festival Thursday (lunar 9/9). Take Friday October 27 off for a four-day break.	Public holiday
Nov 2	Thursday	All Souls' Day Thursday - the same leave trick applies: take Friday November 3 off for four days.	Public holiday
Dec 8	Friday	Feast of the Immaculate Conception Friday, giving a three-day weekend to open the festive season.	Public holiday
Dec 20	Wednesday	Macao SAR Establishment Day Wednesday - with the Winter Solstice the next day it starts a run of four holidays in six days.	Public holiday
Dec 21	Thursday	Winter Solstice Thursday (the solstice falls on December 21 in 2028). Take Friday December 22 off and the break stretches to Christmas Day - six days, December 20-25.	Public holiday
Dec 24	Sunday	Christmas Eve Falls on a Sunday in 2028; Christmas Day follows on Monday. The annual notice usually adds a compensatory rest day for public administration staff.	Public holiday
Dec 25	Monday	Christmas Day Monday, rounding off a three-day weekend from December 23 to 25 - and the year.	Public holiday
